After two SPRC committee meetings for the redevelopment of Melwood on the 23rd Street Nellie Custis school property, there have been changes, such as the relocation of the building entrance and moving the transformers away from the park, but no major structural changes. The proposal will go to the historical board, as well as the transportation, planning and housing commissions before going to the County Board for approval. The plan has created controversy in the surrounding area with many opposing its 5 story height, the potential congestion on 23rd and S. Grant Streets, the effect of the change in its zoning on the future of 23rd Street, and others supporting the affordable housing and independent living for the disabled. How you can help? Stay off the roads, they say; park so plows can maneuver round you, toss cleared snow onto yards, not streets, use only minimum of chemical deicers on sidewalks and driveways.

Arlington's public art program began in 1984 with Nancy Holt's *Dark Star Park* in Rosslyn, and since then has featured works throughout the County. The latest addition is our own neighborhood's *inVISIBLE*, the Dominion Crystal City substation designed by artist Elena Manferdini, at S. Hayes and Fern streets. The artist says it "invites viewers to consider their relationship to the invisible and fundamental force of electricity and the tools used in its creation and distribution." If this is difficult for you to consider, you can just admire it, and hope the electricity stays on through our current snow storm.
