RIVERHOUSE SPRC

In the SPRC meeting the County said it was disappointed in the lack of density in the plan proposed by JBG Smith, and suggested that the County will not achieve its housing goals without more denssity at RiverHouse. It also highlighted a number of areas where the plan was in violation of the Sector Plan, the green ribbon, view corridors, tree buffer behind some buildings. Numerous community members spoke both for and against the current plan, and JBG Smith is revising its plans based on the feedback it received both from County and community.

ARCA and Aurora Highlands Civic Assn. have submitted a joint proposal to the Arlington Neighborhood Program (ANP) for a pedestrian safety project at the Fort Scott Drive and Grant Street intersection, with further safety measures to extend down Grant St. to 29th Rd. AHCA will be the lead on the project while ARCA will provide a block captain to gather signatures of support from impacted residents. EHO/MISSING MIDDLE STRUCK DOWN BY JUDGE

Judge Schell ruled for the homeowners who brought suit against the County Board over its EHO (Missing Middle) ordinance. The EHO was enacted in 2023; the plaintiffs filed suit the next month. EHO allowed developers to build up to 6 unit buildings on nearly all lots that previously allowed only single family detached homes and the court ruled that the County failed to give any consideration to localized impacts on neighbors. ARLINGTON COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL TO BE BUILT IN METROPOLITAN PARK IN 2026

Amazon and Arlington Public Schools (APS) have announced the future home for Arlington Community High School (ACHS) will be in Metropolitan Park with a custom-built space. Established over a century ago, it has never had a permanent home, and was most recently at the Career Center. It will be the new home for over 250 students and staff beginning in the 2026-7 school year. Amazon has been working in partnership with APS to finalize the plans for the diverse student body aged 16 and older, many of whom work full or part time jobs as they earn their high school diplomas. Amazon's partnership with the ACH is part of its commitment to being a good neighbor and community partner, and by providing a home for the program will reduce the long term operating and capital costs for Arlington Public Schools. It was originally planned to be at Amazon's Pen Place.

Arlington residents can earn credit towards their Stormwater Utility by planting trees on their property, and large canopy trees planted through the Arlington Tree Canopy fund are eligible for a 5% credit. Owners of private property can apply to get a native tree planted on their property. Landscape designer Walter Hood, who designed the John Robinson Jr. Town Square, received the National Building Museum 2024 Vincent Scully Prize for exemplary practice in architecture and urban design. Hood's design brings recognition to the history and community of historically Black Green Valley and its ties to Freedman's Village, a community for escaped enslaved African Americans and free persons established at the end of the Civil War on property that became the Pentagon and Arlington Cemetery.

MEMORIALIZING OF THE ENSLAVED IN ARLINGTON https://arlhist.org/enslavement/

"The Memorializing of the Enslaved in Arlington" (MEA) project has borrowed the idea of stumbling stones from the project of a German artist which has placed over 70,000 of the stones throughout Europe to honor Holocaust victims. With the help of Arlington County MEA will place stones throughout Arlington at sites of enslavement to honor the lives and contributions of once enslaved people and tell their story. The markers will be engraved with individual names and stories. MEA is a project sponsored by the Arlington Historical Society and the Black Heritage Museum of Arlington, and brings our county's African American history to light and their important contributions to the development of Arlington County since the late 1700s which have often been misrepresented or left out. Our neighborhood's stumbling stone will be installed at 2345 S. Ode Street, where Mary and Levi Jones Jr

were enslaved by Anthony Fraser.
